Are you a junior or senior researcher with an interest in sport, exercise and osteoarthritis?

The Arthritis Research UK Centre for Sport, Exercise and Osteoarthritis Fellowship Scheme provides the opportunity for researchers to take a 1-3 month sabbatical to work on their project in sport, exercise and osteoarthritis research. Applications are welcome for fellowships to bring external researchers to one of the Centre's sites, or from researchers within the Centre to travel to an external location.

The Centre is particularly keen to support work in multidisciplinary research environments and enable members to become part of an exchange programme with national or international collaborators.

The Fellowship grant can be used to cover reasonable travel, research, accommodation costs.

About the Centre

The Arthritis Research UK Centre for Sport, Exercise and Osteoarthritis is the UK's first research centre bringing together experts in orthopaedics, rheumatology, sport and exercise medicine, physiotherapy, podiatry, epidemiology, nutrition, sports science, skeletal muscle biology, bone and cartilage biology, psychology, physiology and biomechanics, from seven internationally renowned research institutions, to properly understand the relationship between exercise, sport, injury, rehabilitation and osteoarthritis.

The Centre's researchers hope to gain better insight into the development of osteoarthritis following sport and exercise injury, leading to effective prevention and treatments for the general public and sports professionals alike.
